GeoBlade

- We are deep in the process of upgrading our GIS software to Arc Server, ArcSDE databases, and various other upgrades. This includes an upgrade in our Public Safety GIS facilitated through E911/ETSB. GeoBlade dispatch and mobile applications by Geographic Technologies Group will utilize the new software to provide maps and data to

police officers, fire fighters, and EMS personnel. This upgrade will allow mobile and dispatch users to employ the newer color aerial photography and will facilitate significant time savings in getting the latest updates to the units in the field. Using geographic data to assist public safety officials is an essential part of the way GIS is implemented in Whiteside County.

Beacon Website Tip



When completing a search by Name, Address, or Parcel ID (PIN), you are able to sort the results by the information in the columns. Click on a column heading (i.e. Owner) to sort A to Z or click again to sort Z to A or in the case of Parcel ID to sort increasing or decreasing numerically. The columns which can be sorted include Parcel ID, Owner, Property Address, and City.

In the Report tab for a parcel, you can collapse or expand each of the sections by clicking on the double arrow symbol in the upper right hand corner of each section. At the top left hand corner of the parcel summary are icons for Print Setup, Printing, and an Email link. At the top right hand corner, you can set the active layer which is Parcels by default.
